Teaching & Learning

Aiding asylum seekers and unaccompanied minors

Occupational Therapy students participate in a clinical practice program in collaboration with the Kofinou Reception Centre* and the Nicosia Municipal Multifunctional Foundation to support unaccompanied minors and adult asylum seekers in the community. Students and faculty provide free occupational therapy services and volunteer on many calls for Hope for Children CRC Policy Center.





Supporting mental health and well-being of vulnerable children

Nursing students participate in the prevention program **Hug of Inclusion** which provides a safe and creative space for play and learning for vulnerable children. Free classes in Greek, English, Mathematics, Technology and Robotics, Music and Art are offered through this program which is run under the auspices of the **Cyprus Anti-Drug Council**.

Encouraging volunteerism and inclusivity

Seminars and webinars are offered on such topics as the role of volunteering in society in collaboration with the **Office of the Commissioner for Volunteerism and NGOs** and on the significance of the Paralympics and Special Olympics through the **Cyprus Sports Organization**.

Special Needs Committee

The Committee for Students with Special Educational Needs (CSSEN) enables students with special needs and learning challenges to receive support to ensure their academic and personal success at the university. The European University's Committee for Students with Special Needs (EFEEA), provides academic accommodations and/or support to all EUC registered students.

All students who evidently present with one or more of the following difficulties, are eligible to apply for academic accommodations and/or support:

- Learning difficulties: Reading Disorder (Dyslexia), Mathematics Disorder (Dyscalculation),
 Expression Disorder, Learning Disorder not otherwise specified, Special Learning Disorder
- Attention Deficit Hyperactivity Disorder (ADHD)
- Hearing Impairment
- Vision Impairment
- Movement Disability
- Psychological disorders & Emotional Distress
- Health Problems

The academic accommodations and/or support are provided only after assessment and the final decision by EFEEA, all based on the current relevant Cypriot law and international practices.



VACCELERATE is the pan-European backbone for the acceleration of phase 2 & 3 COVID-19 vaccine trials. The overall objective is to connect all European stakeholders involved in vaccine development to provide a pan-European platform for clinical trial design and conduct.

European University Cyprus serves as a Coordinator Country representative (one of 26 partners in total) contributing to important work-packages in the €12m research grant to establish a European bio-defence preparedness program.

Teaching & Learning

Promoting health and wellness to the university community

The Office of Student Affairs runs frequent events to promote health and well-being in the campus community.

In collaboration with the Nutrition and Dietetics Program faculty and students, a number of free consultations, webinars, seminars and events promote healthy cooking and eating habits, body positivity and sustainable healthy behaviors.

With Sports Science students and faculty, the Office of Student Affairs offered a series of online fitness sessions promoting exercise at home during the pandemic.

Alcohol Awareness Week events are run in collaboration with Kenthea and Cyprus Addictions Authority on "Alcohol, Youth and Entertainment". Nursing students and faculty further cooperate with the Cyprus Addictions Authority on the prevention of substance use by teens and students.

The Office of Student Affairs organized a "Stress Management, Quality of Life and Academic Success" webinar to provide students with practical advice on how to cope with stress and improve mental well-being.

Evaluating risk factors of cardiovascular disease

Nursing program staff and students contribute to Exxon Mobil's Health and Prevention program to investigate and evaluate risk factors for cardiovascular diseases in the general population and to raise awareness of prevention and early intervention.

Developing young people as athletes and citizens

Since 2007, EUC's Sports Academy Youth Programs has run a handball program for youth ages 6-18 years, with more than 200 players participating annually on different teams. A "training ground" for life, the program incorporates physical activity with emotional, social and mental growth to develop young people as athletes and healthy adults of the future, imbued with values of cooperation, teamwork and care.

Supporting athletes in higher education

The University awards athletic scholarships to students who participate in the intercollegiate sports teams. These scholarships range from a 5% to 40% reduction of tuition fees and are based upon the participants' level of performance.


Securing high international recognition

Encouraging women and girls in STEAM

Particular initiatives are aimed at encouraging women and girls to enter the predominately male academic disciplines of science, technology, engineering, arts and mathematics (STEAM). Through the Startup Center on campus workshops provided the opportunity to high school aged young women to understand academic and career opportunities in STEAM fields. Emphasis was placed on the future of work and the development of essential soft skills such as emotional intelligence, effective communication, negotiation skills, and mental agility for personal and professional development.

ResAlliance: Landscape resilience knowledge alliance for agriculture and forestry in the Mediterranean basin

The objective of the ResAlliance is to facilitate information and knowledge flow and increase the awareness, understanding and capacity of farmers and foresters on landscape resilience in Mediterranean countries. More specifically, ResAlliance will gather and assess knowledge and practice needs, gaps, barriers, solutions and good practices to achieve resilient landscapes; prepare and facilitate stakeholder engagement through interactive and innovative participation methods; transfer the knowledge and activate regional landscape resilience governance.

One of our central aims at EUC is to promote actions that support environmental policies and increase awareness of environmental issues among the campus community and wider public

CRiTERIAs: Comprehensive data-driven Risk and Threat Assessment Methods for the Early and Reliable Identification, Validation and Analysis of migration-related risks

Contemporary border security challenges are highly complex and inter-related, requiring more cross-sectoral, transdisciplinary and cross-country cooperation in all risk management phases both at the EU and Member States levels. The project seeks to strengthen and expand existing risk analysis methods, by introducing a novel, comprehensive but feasible and human-rights sensitive risk and vulnerability analysis framework for border agencies.

FirEU Risk: Developing a Holistic, Risk-wise Strategy for European Wildfire Management

The project creates an evidence-based strategy to create resilience against wildfires by harmonizing and upgrading current European strategies to include the socio-economic circumstances that affect the occurrence of extreme wildfires as well as the biophysical conditions, such as vegetation and climate.

Focusing on risk and decision science in safety, climate change, civil protection

The Center for Excellence in Innovation and Technology (CERIDES) is a cross- disciplinary, cross-school center of excellence whose research projects focus on the development, use, and evaluation of quantitative and qualitative methods to measure, assess, manage, and communicate risk, and to analyze, design and implement decision-making mechanisms and systems. Cerides' areas of focus revolve around two basic pillars: risk and decision science with an application to several horizontal areas such as security, safety, cybersecurity, climate change, civil protection, telecommunications, critical infrastructure protection, and industrial processes.

Investing in a sustainable campus

In an effort to continually reduce waste and energy consumption, the university applies the international ISO 14001:2018 standard in its environmental management system. All facilities are health and safety inspected and perform at accreditation standards.

Reducing fuel consumption through energyefficient measures

Reflecting EU policy and public concern about global warming, the university's Energy Management Plan centers on increasing awareness of energy issues, reducing fuel consumption through energy-efficient measures, ensuring energy-efficient design standards are implemented and using renewable energy sources.

Using renewable energy sources

Currently, EUC is producing renewable energy through the solar panels installed on the roofs of its main buildings and covering almost the 35% of our total energy needs or 335 MWh per year. In total, 205 kW were installed between 2015 and 2019 resulting the annual savings of 227 tons of GHG emissions and roughly 93 tons of fossil fuels, equivalent to the impact generated by 550 average cars in Cyprus or the total fleet owned by EUC staff. The project brings significant cost savings, clearly demonstrating that financial and environmental sustainability can be delivered together in an impactful way and at scale.



Following strict guidelines in the temporary storage and further treatment of waste, our waste management plan follows environmental law. We are recycling the 100% of our waste excluding of the organic waste, which are driven into the waste compressor operated on campus for minimizing their volume before delivered to the landfill.

Accessing free drinking water on campus

Staff and students have access to filtered tap water from free dispensers in all university buildings and staff kitchen—a measure that greatly reduces single-use plastic water bottle consumption.

CYQCI: Cyprus Quantum Communication Infrastructure

The **CYQCI project** is the first to address the deployment of quantum communications in Cyprus, introducing the technology to the island and setting the foundation for active participation of the country in the EuroQCI. A quantum communications competence centre will be established to offer widely available research, education and training courses, and support to prospective innovation as to contribute to the EU supply chain for relevant technologies and services.



We maintain strong links with industry leaders and dynamic partnerships with employers to inspire students and alumni and to secure high graduate employment rates.



"Ariadne" Psychometric Test on Employment Interests

European University Cyprus is the sole provider of the "Ariadne" psychometric test on employment interests in Cyprus. The Ariadne test was adapted to the Cypriot educational, professional and social circumstances to be scientifically suitable to the student population of Cyprus. It is the only test of its kind that is administered among the high school population of Cyprus, with special permission from the Ministry of Education and Culture. The test is a quick (about 30 minutes) and easy way to highlight a young person's interests and related professions. As part of community outreach efforts, European University Cyprus offers the Ariadne test free of charge to students in their final year of high school (lyceum) in an effort to help them determine their employment interests and start planning their higher education options.

Ariadne Educational and Career Information Services offers final-year high school students and high school graduates one-on-one sessions to discuss the results of the analytical report they receive after completing the Ariadne test. This is an opportunity to discuss interests and to help determine academic majors and career paths that that suit their personal and career aspirations.


During the career exhibition, students have the opportunity to meet professionals from a variety of fields and to gain insights into how the labor market works both in Cyprus and abroad.




