

## Policy on Erasmus+ Mobility Activities for 6th Year Medicine Students

### 1. Purpose

This policy defines the framework governing mobility activities undertaken by 6th year Medicine students, ensuring compliance with the curriculum of the Bachelor of Medicine Program and alignment with Erasmus+ mobility regulations for traineeships.

### 2. Scope

This policy applies to all 6th year Medicine students of the EUC Department of Medicine, Nicosia (Main Campus) and EUC Department of Medicine-Frankfurt Branch, who are approved to pursue clinical rotations through mobility activities, with Erasmus+ Traineeships Scheme.

### 3. Structure of the 6th Year of Studies

1. The 6th year of the Medicine Program is defined as **one single, continuous academic period**.
2. The 6th year **is not divided into semesters** (please see officially approved [curriculum](#) of the Medicine Program).
3. Any approved mobility activity undertaken during the 6th year is considered part of this single consecutive academic period.

### 4. Eligibility for Mobility

1. Only 6th year Medicine students who have received formal approval from their Departments, the School of Medicine and the relevant academic bodies may pursue clinical rotations through mobility schemes.
2. Approval is granted subject to academic requirements, availability of appropriate clinical placements, and compliance with Erasmus+ and institutional regulations.

### 5. Duration of Mobility Activities

1. The **minimum duration** of a mobility activity for 6th year Medicine students is **two (2) months**.
2. The **maximum total duration** of mobility activities for 6th year Medicine students is **twelve (12) months**.
3. The total duration includes one or multiple mobility periods, provided all conditions of this policy are met.

### 6. Mobility Structure and Time Gaps

1. Mobility activities may consist of one or multiple clinical rotations.
2. **Time gaps between clinical rotations are permitted only** when:
  - The rotations are carried out **within the same host country**, and

- The overall structure of the 6th year remains academically coherent and approved.
3. Time gaps do not extend the academic duration beyond the maximum allowable mobility period.

## **7. Erasmus+ Traineeship Framework**

1. Mobility activities undertaken under Erasmus+ are classified as **traineeships**.
2. All Erasmus+ mobility activities must comply fully with the [Outgoing Mobility for Traineeships](#) regulations of the University.
3. Students are required to fulfil all administrative, academic, and reporting obligations applicable to Erasmus+ traineeships.

## **8. Grant Support and Funding Prioritization**

1. Grant support for 6th year Medicine mobility activities is provided in accordance with:
  - Erasmus+ Traineeship grant rules, and
  - The University's **Grant Support and Funding Prioritization Measures**.
2. Funding allocation is subject to:
  - Available Erasmus+ budget,
  - Institutional priorities, and
  - Compliance with all eligibility and reporting requirements.
3. Approval of a mobility activity does not guarantee funding.

## **9. Academic Recognition**

1. All approved mobility activities must correspond to the learning outcomes of the 6th year curriculum.
2. Successful completion of the mobility activity is required for academic recognition.
3. Recognition is granted following submission and validation of all required documentation.

## **10. Compliance and Final Provisions**

1. Students who fail to comply with this policy or applicable Erasmus+ regulations may lose eligibility for funding and/or academic recognition.
2. This policy operates in conjunction with all existing University regulations and Erasmus+ mobility policies.
3. In case of conflict, Erasmus+ regulations and institutional academic rules prevail.
